WELCOME – Fritz W.

NEW MEMBERS

SECRETARY REPORT – Hope D.

- Reviewed Spring 2022 minutes, Steve L motion to approve meeting minutes, 2nd by Dominic P, approved by the group with no amendments/changes
- Continuing to update the Member Roster, as dues are paid I'm verifying the members' contact info
- Officially received 2022 Raffle Licenses from WI Dept of Gaming, valid through May 2023

OLD BUSINESS

BLUE OX DUST CONTROL – Fran, President & Mike, Vice President of Blue Ox present

- Fran, President & Mike, Vice President of Blue Ox present to provide information about the trail and guide us with dust control solutions
- Blue Ox uses calcium chloride/brine on the trail for dust control, costs \$788 every time to do it. Covers from boat landing to Williams Road. Doesn't know how long this solution lasts, depends on trail usage and weather and relies on residents' reports for dust. For perspective, they put the solution down on Wednesday 6/29/22 and it was already wearing off a week later. Blue Ox used to have a trailer with a plastic tank and filled it up with water and salt to spread on the trail, but they struggled finding volunteers for it so they had the county do it instead (costs \$\$\$). They have a contract with the county to groom the trail once a week—Florence County is the only county in the state that has a club that handles the whole county of trails.
- Speed bumps - Jim asked if there are any prohibition on adding speed bumps to the trail. Fran advised that if we put speed bumps in, we're liable for it and the county wouldn't approve that.
- Radar traps - Could we get some from the county to help with speed? Someone asked if the county even has them, Sissie said no the county does not have any. Radar traps may help, but then you'd need someone there to issue the ticket.
- Crushed blacktop idea - Highway 70 will be under construction next year so maybe we can get crushed blacktop to put on the trail for dust control? Sissie asked for clarification from Fran—do we need to get permission to make any changes to the trails (i.e. adding crushed blacktop) and who would we ask? Fran—Blue Ox maintains the trail, the state owns the trail, and the county oversees the trail. We need permission from the county to do something like this. We can't guarantee that crushed blacktop would forever solve the dust problem, but it helps a lot and it takes years for it to break down again.
- Funding/Cost—Sissie asked if there are funds available for whatever the group decides in regards to dust control solutions. Fran works with the county for funds to maintain the trail, there's \$45K in grant money coming to Blue Ox. The grant money goes through the county forestry service. ATV association of millions of dollars for grants for trails that is specifically for north of Highway 8/64. Scott paid \$485/load for his driveway and estimated that the trail would need 20-30 loads.
- **Next steps**—Joe will talk to the fire department to ask about spraying the trail. Scott will get in touch with an excavator/grader and talk to the town. Fran is going to check on grants available. Fritz will lead this project and coordinate with Fran to discuss at the next meeting.

GRANT ACTIVITIES TO DATE – JOE H.

- Has been partnering with White Water Associates for grant project management, and they have been great to work with. A few surveys have been done already—in February John and Joe took water oxygen levels and they came back very low, even around the aerator (not good). This is probably why the fish are lethargic in the winter.
- June Survey—Thank you to Sissie and Steve who volunteered with pontoons to go out and do surveys of invasive species around the lakeshore. Purple loosestrife was found, it's been around the lake for a while but it was the only invasive species found which is good news. Also did a shoreline survey, which counts all docks, piers, and downed/submerged trees and logs and we have just shy of 300, which is the most they've seen on a lake this size. Downed trees in the lake are the best thing for fish cribs and filtration for the water.
- Upcoming Survey—July 26th & July 27th. White Water Associates will be here again to survey the lake and aquatic vegetation samples. Need volunteers with boats to help drive the team.
- Water Clarify Survey—Scott V. has been doing water clarity surveys (works for the DNR as a lake biologist) throughout the summer. As of June 15th the lake oxygen reading goes down 12-15 feet. Also not much algae in the lake and phosphorous is normal for the lake. He'll be back July 11-14th for another round of samples if anyone wants to learn how to do this.

- Joe's Bucket—Joe took a 5 gallon pail down to the south end and sent it 17 feet down to the bottom of the lake. Brought up the pail of muck and water, strained it, let it dry, and showed it at the meeting. Muck doesn't have a smell which is good, about 20% moisture content which shows there's a lot of suspended sediment down there. White Water Associates took sediment samples to check for heavy metal content, oil contamination, etc. and hopefully that comes back all organic and not contaminated. Dredging the lake was discussed in the past in regards to the south end—the hardest solution is where you'll put the muck.
- Grant continues for another year, then we'll see results and plan the next steps for the lake.

NEW BUSINESS

VOLUNTEERS FOR GRANT ACTIVITIES

- Need volunteers for July 26th and 27th. White Water Associations will be doing additional surveys of the lake and taking aquatic vegetation samples. 2 day job, 6-7 hours a day and looking for volunteers to drive boats for that. Get in touch with Joe if available.

SUMMER FISHING DERBY

- Donations—As of right now Scott has very few donations. Hope will send the Donation Letter to the members to gather more donations. We need small stuff like prizes for the punchboard or baskets, \$15-20 items are perfect for the punchboard.
- Punchboard—Kristy asked if we want to do 1 punch board or 2 punch boards? Past punchboard funds:
 - 2019 Summer - \$5506 with 1 punchboard
 - 2020 Winter - \$4929 with 1 punchboard
 - 2020 Summer - \$5678 with 1 punchboard
 - 2021 Winter - \$6705 with 1 punchboard
 - 2021 Summer - \$9800 + \$9900 with 2 punchboards (1 for Fri + 1 for Sat)
- Yes we should do 2 punchboards, have 1 for Friday night and 1 for Saturday but we need enough prizes and volunteers.
- Volunteers—Friday night starts at 6pm, we need volunteers to run the punchboard, registration, big ticket items/card raffles, etc. Saturday we need fish measurers on the lake. Think we need name tags or lanyards or something to make it clear who is volunteering with the Lake Association when Roadhouse gets busy. Saturday is the hardest day because the bar is packed and we get a lot of people asking what the event is for, it's a lot of activity and it's hard when you don't have enough people. Rob & Erika Balza will volunteer reflective vests for the Association volunteers to wear during fishing derby events.

DONATION TO BIG 4+ SPORTSMAN'S CLUB

- Big 4+ Sportsmans Club has asked us to donate for their annual picnic. Scott thinks no until they start donating to us. Jim doesn't want to slam the door on the club, sometimes we need to give to receive. They used to give \$500 a year for our aerator expenses, they also helped with the initial pier so we should keep a good relationship with them. Sissie always sent a gift on behalf of the Lake Association. Fritz will coordinate with Big 4+ and get a gift and bring it to their annual picnic.
- Sissie made a motion to allocate \$50-\$100 annually to support the Big 4+ Annual Fundraiser. 1st Jim/2nd Steve

OTHER BUSINESS

- Guillette family doing a float in the parade for the Lake Association
- Rob and Erika Balza will donate yellow safety vests to the association for volunteers to wear during events so we're easily identifiable

- Joe recognized Scott and Bob for saving the swimming raft, it broke lose on a windy day and they caught it before it hit the fishing pier
- Hope has had two people ask about posting meeting minutes on the FB page, don't think it should be shared publicly on the FB page. Joe and Sissy agreed, meeting minutes and financials should be for internal use only

MINUTES SUMMARY FOR 9/3/22 MEETING

DUST CONTROL

Fran, the President and Mike, the Vice President of the Blue Ox Trail Riders group were present at the last meeting to provide information about the trail and help guide us with potential solutions in regards to dust control. For some background information, the state owns the trail, the county oversees it, but the Blue Ox group maintains the trail from the boat landing down to Williams Road.

Currently for dust control, the group uses a calcium chloride brine on the trail. They don't officially know how long the brine lasts on the trail, but Fran mentioned at the last meeting that they sprayed the trail on June 29th and within a week it was already wearing off and it costs \$788 every time they do it.

We talked about a few ideas for dust control with Fran—we asked about adding speed bumps, but that would be a liability and the county wouldn't approve it. We asked about radar traps, which could help, but then we'd need someone there to issue the ticket. The potential solution that we are looking into more is adding crushed blacktop. We would do more research on pricing and logistics for this idea and continue the discussion as a group.

GRANT UPDATES FROM JOE

Joe shared a few updates with our grant activities. We've been partnering with White Water Associates for all grant activities and a few surveys have been done already. In June they did a survey of invasive species around the lakeshore. They also did a shoreline survey, which counts all docks, piers, and downed or submerged trees and logs. There was another survey done at the end of July that I'm sure Joe will provide an update on today.

SUMMER FISHING DERBY

At our last meeting we were in the midst of planning the summer fishing derby, which is now behind us. At the last meeting we talked about if we wanted to do 1 punchboard or 2 for this summer event, and Kristy shared financial numbers from our past events as far as how much the punchboard brings in for the association and that helped us decide to do 2 punchboards this year. Today we'll share a recap of the summer fishing derby that happened on August 13th.

DONATION TO BIG 4+ SPORTSMAN CLUB

The Sportsmans Club asked us to donate a prize item for their annual picnic, which was back in July. We decided as a group and made a motion to allocate \$50 to \$100 each year to support the club's annual fundraiser. This motion was approved and the association president will be responsible for delivering that donation item each year.
